

Once For All  
Hebrews 10:10

INTRO: The Lord Jesus Christ suffered for His people, once for all time.

The Bible plainly teaches that we do not crucify Christ over and over again. Hebrews 9:26-28 point to the fact that Christ came to earth to pay our sin debt once for ALL!!! *For then must he often have suffered since the foundation of the world: but now once in the end of the world hath he appeared to put away sin by the sacrifice of himself. And as it is appointed unto men once to die, but after this the judgment: So Christ was once offered to bear the sins of many; and unto them that look for him shall he appear the second time without sin unto salvation.*

I. CHRIST OUR HIGH PRIEST

- A. The High Priest was the only one allowed into the Holy of Holies, and when he went in, he had to take the blood of sacrifice with him (Heb 9:6-8). This was done year after year.
- B. Hebrews 9:11-14 – teaches that Christ entered the holy place with His own blood (vs 12).
  - 1. It is the blood offered for us that purges us from all sin (vss 13-14).
  - 2. Christ our High Priest appears in heaven for us (vs 24).
  - 3. Christ was offered only once. He is not offered again.

II. THE SACRIFICE TO END ALL SACRIFICES

- A. Hebrews 10:1-4, tells us that offerings were made year to year by the earthly high priests because these offerings could not justify the people.
- B. When Christ was crucified, His death was the sacrifice to end all sacrifice for sin.
  - 1. We are sanctified by the blood of Christ– the once for all offering (vs 10).
  - 2. I want us to go back to Hebrews 9:28 once again: *So Christ was once offered to bear the sins of many;.... Once offered! Once for all time.*

III. HE SAT DOWN

- A. In Hebrews 1:3, we read that Christ sat down after He paid our sin debt.
- B. The high priests of the Old Testament do not sit down in the

Temple because their work was never done.

1. Christ sat down because He purchased my redemption once for all time.
2. Hebrews 10:11, tells us of the high priest standing daily could not offer a sacrifice to take away permanently.
3. Hebrews 10:12 tells us that “this man,” the God man, did what no other could ever do. He offered, “one sacrifice for sins for ever.”

#### IV. HE'S VICTORIOUS

CONCLUSION: He is not on the cross; He is not in the tomb.
